Transurban today released its March quarter 2026 traffic update. Due to the broader macroeconomic and geopolitical environment, largely relevant to March, a monthly breakdown average daily traffic (ADT) growth is provided in the table below:

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Regional updates

Broader portfolio specific factors included the following.

Sydney

In Sydney, ADT increased by 0.6% for the quarter. Results were impacted by ongoing construction-related disruptions with increased works on Warringah Freeway, which is anticipated to open by the end of 2026. In addition, widened sections of the M7 will progressively open across the June quarter.

- ADT increased by 0.6% to 1,032k trips
- Average workday traffic increased by 0.7% and average weekend/public holiday traffic increased by 0.1%
- Car traffic increased by 0.5% and large vehicle traffic increased by 1.4%

Melbourne

Melbourne traffic increased by 3.8% for the quarter, largely reflecting the contribution from the new West Gate Tunnel (WGT), which opened on 14 December 2025, and continued strength in large vehicle traffic on CityLink (+3.1%). The opening of WGT saw approximately 1% redistribution of CityLink traffic².

- ADT increased by 3.8% to 866k transactions
- Average workday traffic increased by 4.0% and average weekend/public holiday traffic increased by 2.5%
- Car traffic increased by 0.2% and large vehicle traffic increased by 17.1%
- The average truck toll was \$18.24 per trip in part reflecting capped, repeat, combined trips on West Gate Tunnel and CityLink

Brisbane

Brisbane ADT grew by 5.2% compared to the prior corresponding period that included the impacts of Tropical Cyclone Alfred³, while underlying traffic performance was 0.7%. Large vehicle traffic remained strong, growing by 7.5% (underlying large vehicle performance was 3.2%³).

- ADT increased by 5.2% to 474k trips
- Average workday traffic increased by 5.1% and average weekend/public holiday traffic increased by 5.6%
- Car traffic increased by 4.5% and large vehicle traffic increased by 7.5%

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North America⁴

In North America, traffic increased by 7.9%, primarily driven by continued ramp-up of the 495 Northern Extension (NEXT) project. Traffic on the 95 Express Lanes grew by 4.5%, while the 495 Express Lanes saw a 17.2% increase.

- ADT increased by 7.9% to 164k trips
- Rolling 12-month peak direction traffic of 2,913 vehicles per hour on the A25

Macroeconomic environment

Transurban will continue to monitor the impact of the current geopolitical and macro-economic environment. The duration and extent of any impacts will depend on geopolitical developments in key energy-producing regions, government policy decisions and the broader macroeconomic response.

Transurban's roads form important urban transport infrastructure and are integral to motorists' everyday activities, helping keep Australia's capital cities moving. Historically, Transurban has demonstrated resilience in periods of market dislocation, with more than 90% of revenue CPI-linked or with fixed escalations. In addition, Transurban's roads provide more fuel efficient and safer alternatives for road users.

Transurban continues to provide support through Linkt Assist and encourages customers experiencing financial hardship to make contact for assistance. Community organisations experiencing increased demand, such as those providing emergency relief and supporting personal transport, may be eligible for Transurban's community grants program, which has been expanded to provide more immediate assistance with cost-of-living pressures. Additionally, Transurban has brought forward its payment terms with small suppliers to 14 days from 30.
