# Safety smarts for young cyclists

Kids will soon be learning the road rules in a fun, interactive environment. A new cycle park is opening at Demeio Park, Marsden, and it's all about getting our youngest road users up to speed on basic road safety.

# Signs, lines and sharing the road

Designed to resemble a real road, the cycle park will allow kids to interpret and understand different road signs, experience travel at different speeds and learn how to give way and share the road safely.

The park's design is also inspired by elements from local South East Queensland communities, including the Karawatha Forest, the suburbs and industrial zone, the Brisbane River and the Logan River Red Bridge.

## **Building the park**

We're set to start building in a matter of weeks. Provided the weather allows and construction goes as planned, the cycle park should be finished and ready for its first riders in mid 2020.

This cycle park is a legacy of the Transurban-led Logan Enhancement Project, and is being designed and built in collaboration with the Logan City Council.

We're also building another cycle park in Greenways Esplanade Park in Parkinson.

# **Design inspiring exploration and education**

The design below takes inspiration from Logan's industrial areas, Karawatha Forest and two iconic bridges: one bridge representing the Sir Leo Hielscher Bridges and the Logan River Red Bridge.

Kids can cycle along lined roads, through a roundabout and navigate common road signs, turning lanes, a pedestrian crossing and more. The park offers a safe way to learn how to share the road, obey road signs and make safe decisions.

About 220 metres of pathway will be included in the cycle park.
